Facilities Tour Update from 12/9: General Notes



Penn Wynne, Merion, Cynwyd

- Space available at Cynwyd (2 open classrooms).
- No space availability at Merion or Penn Wynne.
- With spaces divided & redivided over the years, spaces are maximized
 - A blank space mentality could be used to reconfigure or reconstruct to gain/maximize space
- Not all classrooms are designed for K-aged students (sinks/bathrooms, furniture, etc)
 - With incremental changes over the year an overarching physical classroom template does not exist: Consider using FDK implementation as opportunity to reset a guiding template that can be adapted to changing cohort and section counts.
- Consider under-utilized space (ex., Tower space at Merion) and what's needed for full-time usage (construction/updates for allowable use)

Facilities Tour Update from 12/16: General Notes



Program fits at BH, GL, & likely PV

- BH: (1) unused classroom in K hallway; Planned current class locations with eventual FDK in mind
- GL has space for (6) sections - all with bathrooms
- PV has an empty classroom - predicted for upper grade large section numbers next year, but...
- Penn Valley & BH - Investigate small group classes in full size spaces - could possibly be redistributed to create & maximize K spaces (PV had a much larger enrollment at one time and they made it work); PV library space could be reconstructed to house STEM

Bathrooms in classrooms: GL: Current 1st grade/ BH some K rooms / PV Right side classes

- Would need more information to determine degree of additional space that could be created to accommodate PW & ME needs (within or across buildings)

Facilities Tour Summary



- Space exists at Gladwyne, Cynwyd, Belmont Hills
- Penn Valley could possibly redistribute some small instructional programs to garner additional classrooms
- Penn Wynne and Merion pose the largest challenges for classroom space
- The addition of a full-day program will lead to stress on building capacity
 - Partner school scenarios
 - Larger class sizes due to facilities constraints
 - Specials on a cart

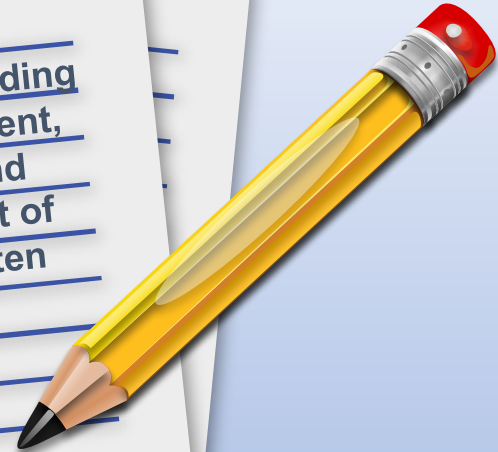

Implications of Data So Far

Area	Information	Implication for planning
Facilities	Three buildings can house the program. Three buildings will need significant planning and coordination to house FDK	Will require: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Time for facilities planning, construction, costs• Cross-building programming• Development of transportation pathways• Development of procedures for student selection/placement
Enrollment Study	Will require: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• 13-17 classrooms• 17-22.5 classroom teachers• An unknown number of special education & support staff	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Significant budget impact• May not be feasible over one budget year
Survey	Large degree of FDK support overall	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Make recommendation in January• Move from recommending to planning

Learnings to Date



- Space concerns will not be quickly resolved
 - May need cross building programming for some schools without space
 - Reconfiguration/reconstruction needs time for planning, budgeting, and construction
- Budgetary impact is still being understood and may need a multi-year rollout
- District has committed to a variety of other priorities this year
- Administrative input tells us that a rushed implementation impacts quality of programming and design

Recommendations



- Information gathered in collaboration with the full-day kindergarten committee shows that successful implementation will not be possible until fall 2024.
- **Recommendation: The Board to authorize the District's Administration to move forward with planning for 2024-25 implementation of universal Full-Day Kindergarten.**
- We also recommend that we investigate the feasibility of a soft roll out such as the expansion of K Plus or something similar in the 2023-2024 school year.

Timeline Considerations



January -

- Electronic Survey closed 1/6/23
 - Survey indicates overall support of FDK
- Community pressure to advance timeline in support of family decision-making
- Public Presentation of status, Administrative recommendation for the start of Full Day Kindergarten
- Follow up presentation on full survey results anticipated in **February**

Timeline Considerations - Moving Forward



February - April

- Review Survey Data
- Create a timeline for possible classroom locations, necessary facilities upgrades, and student assignment procedures

May

- Final estimation of ALL staffing

Fall 2023

- Programmatic discussions including site visits
- Budget Projections (including staffing, materials/resources, facilities upgrades)
