What is the difference between universities and community colleges?

UNIVERSITIES & COLLEGES

- 4 years = 120 credits
- 40-100+ students (class size)
- Cost \$10,000+ annually
- SAT/ACT required
- Dorms on-campus housing

COMMUNITY COLLEGES

- 2 years = 60 credits
- 10-25 students (class size)
- Cost averaging \$5,700*
- No SAT/ACT required
- No dorms (usually)

What programs are offered at community colleges?

- College/university transfer
 - Associate in Art
 - Associate in Science
- Technical
 - Associate in Applied Science
- Career Training
 - Certificates
- Basic skills
 - GED
 - ESL
 - Developmental reading, writing and math
- Special interest
 - Recreation
 - Hobbies

Admission to a Community College

- Most have open enrollment policies
- No SAT or ACT required
- Transcript evaluation and placement testing is typically used to determine your academic course level
- Selective admissions to certain highdemand programs
- Community colleges usually review and admit applicants year-round.


OF STUDENTS ARE EMPLOYED OR IN GRAD SCHOOL 1 YEAR AFTER GRADUATION

AT LEAST ONE INTERNSHIP BEFORE GRADUATION



- Common Application
- Academic transcript
- Extracurricular activities
- Recommendations
- Personal statement
- Standardized testing/test optional
- Visit/virtual visit

Merit Scholarships

- Eisenhower: \$40,000 per year
- Lincoln: \$35,000 per year
- Presidential: \$30,000 per year
- David Wills: \$28,000 per year
- Founders: \$20,000 per year
- STEM Scholars: need met with grants
- Music Scholarships: \$20,000 and \$37,000 per year

- Early Decision I: November 15
- Early Decision II: January 15
- Regular Decision: January 15



 - Cost will depend on which university you attend




PA STATE UNIVERSITIES

- Mostly DII Athletics





HONORS PROGRAM

Gain access to exclusive, small classes, no-appointment-necessary advising, Honors housing as well as leadership and research opportunities. Our first Rhodes scholar Hazim Hardeman '17 was in the Honors Program, and was a transfer student.

DIAMOND RESEARCH SCHOLARS

Team up with a faculty member for mentored research or a creative arts project.

TUTEACH

Earn a degree in a math or science field along with the qualifications to obtain a middle or high school teaching certificate at the same time through TU teach.

PRE-PROFESSIONAL HEALTH STUDIES

Take advantage of our advising and accelerated programs to help you seamlessly transition into medical, dental or another professional health school.

One popular, very competitive program is our Pre-med Health Scholars, which offers provisional acceptance to our Lewis Katz School of Medicine. You can apply for this program right after you apply to Temple and it's strongly encouraged to apply by the Early Action (Nov. 1) deadline.

APPLICATION PROCESS FOR

FIRST-YEAR STUDENTS

To start, you'll need to submit the Common Application and specify your decision plan (You must check Early Action to get an earlier decision.) Next, you'll activate your TUportal account, where you'll submit additional materials that could include

- self-reported transcripts from a U.S.-based high school/secondary school (for U.S. citizens and permanent residents only);
- official standardized test scores (SAT, ACT or approved international qualification), unless you plan to apply test optional; and
- English language proficiency test (TOEFL, IELTS, Duolingo English test, etc.) if required.

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

The application process may involve additional options or required documents, such as official high school/secondary school transcripts.

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WE'RE TEST OPTIONAL

Because we know test scores don't always reflect your strengths, you can choose not to submit test scores by applying with Temple Option.

If you believe an SAT or ACT score would complement your application, you should submit your scores. Standardized test scores are otherwise entirely optional and in no way required for admission.

WHAT'S TUPORTAL?

It's a platform we use to communicate with you and provide important updates throughout the application and enrollment process. This is where you will complete the self-report transcript so you'll need to activate an account to complete your application.
