AUDIENCE RECOGNITION

SUPERINTENDENT'S UPDATE

Mr. Copeland shared the following updates:

- Congratulations are in order for the 24 Lower Merion High School TSA students who competed at the National TSA Conference. The Aces claimed five 2nd-place finishes, and two additional top-ten finishes. More than 250-thousand students nationwide compete for a chance to go to the National Conference each year.
- Congratulations are also in order for four Lower Merion Bus Drivers who were among 95 competitors at the 43rd Annual Pennsylvania State School Bus Safety Competition. Congratulations to Beth McGowan, who placed 2nd... John Welsh who placed 3^{rd...} and Kimberly Bringhurst, who placed 7th in the Transit Division. Stephen Hallman was a Top-Twenty finisher in the Conventional Division.
- Lower Merion School District is among the sponsors of the LM Summer Café, a free summer lunch and fun program at Ardmore Presbyterian Church. Any child under the age of 18 is welcome to stop by Monday through Thursdays from noon until two.
