# LMSD Board of School Directors Jan. 24, 2022, Business Meeting Highlights

# **SUPERINTENDENT UPDATE/PRESENTATIONS**

Dr. Mumin discussed his community meeting at Zion Baptist Church where the importance of student voice was emphasized. He then introduced the student representatives to give their reports.

## **COMMITTEE MEETING REPORTS**

Lower Merion High School Student School Board Representative Emmi Wu said that the majority of students and staff are being conscientious about COVID and are reminding each other to wear masks. She said topics of concern include the availability of COVID tests for staff and also the issue of sexism in STEM classes, particulary an offering of a STEM course for women and non-binary students only. As midterms begin, she stated that midterms are stressful and many students are wondering if midterms are necessary, especially since they contribute to stress. The students are looking forward to Amazing Ace, TSA weekend and the Hope Classic.

Harriton High School Student School Board Representative Eli Feldman noted that close to half the school opted for virtual classes for the two weeks after break, but it's good to see everyone in person again. He also mentioned midterms starting and that while upperclassmen appreciate the break in the regular schedule and that some teachers are offering projects in lieu of exams, underclassmen are more stressed, since they didn't have midterms before. School spirit is good, as students are supporting sports teams and other events.

Ms. Klain reported on the Dec. 22, 2021, meeting of the Ad Hoc Committee on Equity and Anti-Racism where the new Director of Equity position was discussed, along with expanding the District's program with the Montgomery County Vocational and Technical High School.

Ms. Kalish reported on the Jan. 5, 2022, Curriculum Committee of the Board, where the new course offerings for K-8 were discussed, along with the extension of the Performance Tracker contract, scheduling for the K-4 day and an overview of the 5-8 programming. Finally, there was an update on the dual enrollment program. The current program with USciences is being discontinued by the university. The administration recommends switching the program to a

program with Gwynedd Mercy College in the fall, which will be taught by LMSD teachers and work better with our high school schedules.

Ms. Shafmeister reported on the Jan. 20, 2022, Facilities and Purchasing Committee meeting, which included review of the following items: the list of bills, the contracts and purchasing report items listed on tonight's agenda and an update on construction of the new middle school.

### **AUDIENCE RECOGNITION**

During audience recognition, students and residents commented on the following topics, in person and via the chat feature on Zoom.

- Changes in school culture and fewer opportunities for students to collaborate and socialize at LMHS in recent weeks and BCMS students not being allowed to attend sports events or high school tours during COVID.
- Opposition to Mask-to-Stay and current MCOPH quarantine and isolation guidance, which the speaker thought were too relaxed.
- Timeline for making masks optional and allowing elementary students to remove masks and intermingle at recess.
- Full day kindergarten and a suggestion to use public school funds to pay for children to attend full-day private kindergartens.
- Which in-person spring activities will be happening for all schools?
- Issues with LMSD transportation to independent schools.
- The cost and necessity of playing fields for BRMS and the trees that will be cut down to build the fields.
- Disconnecting the issues of later start times for high schools and lights at Arnold Field.
- District legal fees.
