  - A. wound up to be not necessary since have about 130 less students than expected.
  - B. two demographers working to plan how many students will be here in future

  - B. BCMS enrollment is growing due to growth in elementary feeder schools

#### IV. Law Suit

- A. fund balance
  - 1. Claim: district has funds available, saving them away and not using them and raising taxes
  - 2. Three overarching themes we budget for in district
    - a) how do we budget for state and federal mandates
    - b) school board requirements
    - c) budgeting for core values (what the community wants to do)
      - (1) e.g. students can take more classes than required and would require extra staffing
        - (a) LM has done this for years, but is something that adds value and that LM does
      - (2) Levels of services
        - (a) LM supports low class sizes although not required
      - (3) High regard for facilities in the community
        - (a) things are not value engineered down
      - (4) Budget for the worst case scenario and hope for the best
        - (a) eq. snow removal
      - (5) High level of staffing to meet needs for kids with special needs, which includes gifted

- (a) we would never make a placement based upon the cost but based upon the needs of the kids
- (b) new hire to make program evaluations within the district who reports directly to superintendent
  - i) gift/talented program is the first one under review
  - ii) future: AP programs, math programs
  - iii) this is a value added program
- (c) Will be presented at education meeting
- (6) 1.2 million allocated for charter schools
  - (a) PA mandate school districted to provide but unfunded
  - (b) \$19K on standard for all levels if there is an IEP it goes up to over 40 million for all IEPs
    - this is the level that the district provides however IEPs are based on services for children
      - (1) the charters can use special funds more than for special services if services cost less but district must keeps funds within special
      - (2) state legislature need to change laws to ensure that district is not funding the business but the student
- 3. Claim: Too much money left over is too much

  - b) Total fund balance 21.6% of the total District 2016-17 budget being about \$55.9 million total fund balance, allocated as follows in compliance with the law:
    - (1) 15 million for future capital projects,
    - (2) \$15.3 for PSER (state pension system)
      - (a) state predicts to rise to 20 million in 5 years
    - (3) other employees benefits \$5 million
    - (4) Rate stabilization is half a million since not a fixed
    - (5) \$10 facilities
    - (6) 20 million unassigned of which is \$11 million is for responsible financing and 9 million to cover deficit this year
      - (a) state requires it to be below 8%. The district is at 4% is well in compliance
    - (7) We are in the majority of most communities with 1/3 of districts having a higher fund balance.
      - (a) 168th/500
  - c) audited every year and every 2-3 years an auditor general makes an audit and all years the audits have been clean. Fund balance in last audited year
- B. Claim: Transparency
  - 1. claim that it is happening not in the open refute since all is happening at meetings that are open to the public.
- C. District Respectfully disagree with the judges decision at the common plea court
  - 1. next step is that the district has retained an attorney and was officially agreed to be hired by board at 9/12/16 board meeting
    - a) filed an appeal at the common court
    - b) asked for emergency relief
      - (1) already started budgeting for next year
    - c) board put \$4 million in escrow as a good faith effort on part of the district in case district loses appeal, the funds are available
