



Senior Timeline: Fall and Winter



- Athletes: Register with the NCAA for Div. I & II.
- Register for college visits at Harriton and visit college campuses in person.
- □ Complete all parts of Common App and the SRAR when required. Be prepared for deadlines as early as Oct. 15 Nov. 15.
- Request fee waivers for both testing and college applications when necessary
- Communicate with your counselor and teacher recommenders.
- Review and submit your applications in Common App and others
- Apply for Financial Aid https://studentaid.gov/h/apply-for-aid/fafsa October 1 FAFSA is open
- Register for AP Exams if taking AP classes

Senior Timeline: Winter and Spring





- Complete Regular Decision, ED II, and Rolling Applications
- Complete all Financial Aid documents: FAFSA, Profile, College Forms
- Be realistic, balanced, and prepared for Decisions:
 - Accept (Congratulations!)
 - Deny (disappointing but not the end of the world)
 - Waitlist (if interested, maintain good grades and send later)
 - Defer (send a letter of continued interest and good grades later)
 - Conditional Acceptance (rare, but may have requirements)
 - Guarantee Transfer (rare, acceptance possible a year from now)

Important deposit deadline for most all colleges EA, RD, Rolling is May 1



What application plan is best for you?

Regular Decision

Submit by specified date, receive decision in clearly stated period of time.

Early Decision I & II (ED)

Binding commitment to 1st choice - if admitted, student will definitely enroll and withdraw all other applications.

Rolling Admission

Applications are reviewed as they are submitted, decisions are rendered throughout the cycle.

Restrictive Early Action (REA)

Apply to institution of preference and receive decision early, may be restricted from ED or EA/REA at other institutions.

Early Action (EA)

Apply early and receive a decision well in advance of regular response date.



Navigating "Test Optional"....







- More than 1,800 four-year schools will not require students to submit ACT/SAT scores to be considered for fall 2023 enrollment.
- At the most selective institutions, students who are in the top quartile
 and incredibly qualified may be denied. This often has nothing to do
 with the decision to send (or not send) test scores.
- Questions to consider:
 - Are scores required to be considered for merit aid/scholarships?
 - How do my scores fit in with the rest of my application?
 - What does the data from last year's application cycle tell me?




Mechanics of the Process



Student

- Completes & submits application & essay
- Signs FERPA Waiver
- Sends test scores directly from testing agency
- SRAR (if applicable)
- Requests transcripts
- Requests recommendations







Teacher


Uploads letter of recommendation to Naviance and submits to colleges



Naviance: Colleges I'm Applying To












How do I know when a transcript has been sent?



Please note:

- Paper transcript requests "no request" listed under Transcripts in Naviance is ok!
- Things don't all have to arrive at the same time.
- College "missing document" emails are autogenerated - they may not have downloaded what we have sent or matched it to your application yet!

The status "Pending" under "Office materials" will change to "initial materials submitted".





Common App - FERPA



FERPA regulates the privacy of student education records, which could include your application to the college <u>where you enroll.</u>
FERPA also gives you the right to review confidential letters of recommendation provided as part of that application after you enroll.

In the application you'll be asked if you want to waive the right to review confidential letters of recommendation.

Waiving your right lets colleges know that you do not intend to read your recommendations, which helps reassure colleges that the letters are candid and truthful.

Conquering the Common Application: What to Know for Self-Reporting Courses & Grades

1. The Education Section

You will be required to enter the following information:

- · Graduating Class Size: 355
- · Class Rank Reporting: None
- GPA Scale: 5.0
- · GPA Weighting: Weighted
- Your Cumulative GPA can be found on your transcript.

2. Courses & Grades Section

- Select "Yes" when asked "I can access a copy of my transcript or official grades"
- · When reporting your transcript
 - Grading Scale: A-F
 - Schedule System: Semester
 - Later you can select yearly or semester for each individual course
- Everything that is on your transcript MUST be included on the list
- Write the name of each course EXACTLY as you see it on your transcript

Note: Some schools (such as Pitt, Penn State and Temple) have a **separate** Self-Reporting system. For these schools, you must submit your Self-Reported grades through their system **after** you complete your Common Application. Once you send the Common App, these schools will reply to you with a link for their self-reporting system.

- The 2022-23 FAFSA form asks for 2020 tax information. Application and information available at https://studentaid.gov/h/apply-for-aid

- Net Price Calculators give estimates for each individual college of the potential cost of attendance
